# 4. First-aid measures

### **Description of first aid measures**

## 5. Fire-fighting measures

Methods for containment Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Cover with DRY earth, DRY sand or other

rain.

Methods for cleaning up With clean shovel place material into clean, dry container and cover loosely; move

containers from spill area. Flush area with flooding quantities of water. Prevent product from entering drains. Cover powder spill with plastic sheet or tarp to minimize spreading and

keep powder dry.
